Craft - Make a Cliff Swallow Nest

You will need:

- a 6-egg cardboard egg carton (or cut a 12-egg one in half)
- yellow construction paper
- contrast color construction paper
- glue and scissors



1. cut the ends off the egg containers so that the hole is about 1 inch across (get a parent to help!)
2. Cut 12 triangles 1 inch by 1 ¼ inch and fold each, matching the long sides. Fit and glue two together at the wide end to make bird beaks.
3. Glue the beaks so that they face outward from the egg cups.
4. Glue the 'nest' onto the contrast color paper and write above it: "I will be on time."
